entails first-hand. Our attitude toward giving, however, need not be pained if we trust that God will always provide from His abundance. There is a freedom in trusting God, a freedom that loosens our grip on our precious commodities because we are confident God will supply more. Abundance Through Stewardship, a new pamphlet from Our Sunday Visitor, can help inspire this confidence in your parishioners. It's an excellent tool to spark a consideration of faith and trust, the cornerstones of successful stewardship.

PARISH HOW-TO

• IN GOD WE TRUST Host a discussion on the relationship between tithing and trust, reading Matthew 6:25-34. The pamphlet allows those who attend to take the message home.

• THE LAND OF PLENTY Read

the pamphlet with your youth group, then try a trust exercise in which one leans back while others catch him. List examples of abundance in their lives and help them identify ways to give sacrificially.

• FOR ME? Wrap copies of the pamphlet in boxes and hand them out at a small faith group. Explain that you are giving them the gifts of trust and joy, gifts they'll open again in giving their own gifts to God and their community.

• THIS WILL ONLY HURT FOR A SECOND Send the pamphlet home with your religious education students. Ask their families to identify one way that week that they can "give till it hurts," whether it be time, possessions, or money, and suggest praying for greater trust.

• ALL TOGETHER NOW Use Abundance Through Stewardship to kick off a parishwide "abundance fest" — a day when everyone gives. Daylong events could include a rummage sale, bake sale, performances by musical parishioners, parish cleanup crews, and a running tally of donations made that day.
